

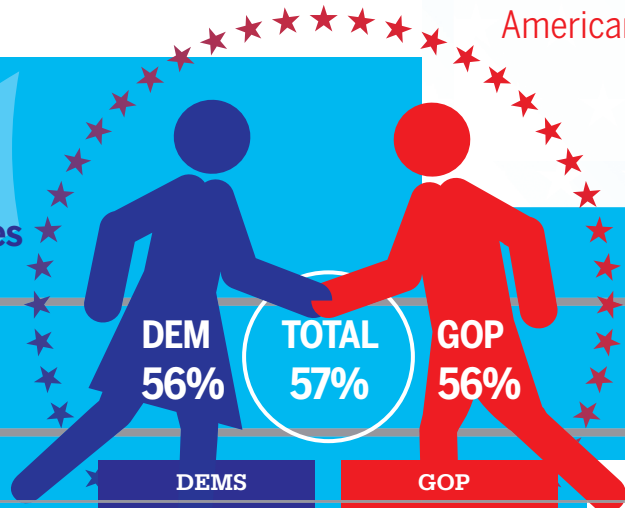
Civic education has massive cross-partisan appeal as a solution to what ails our democracy.

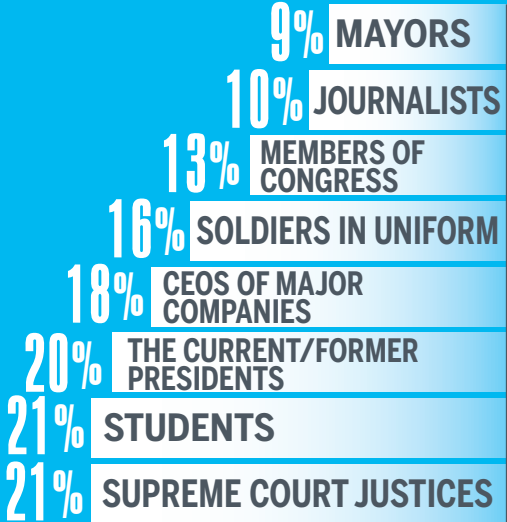
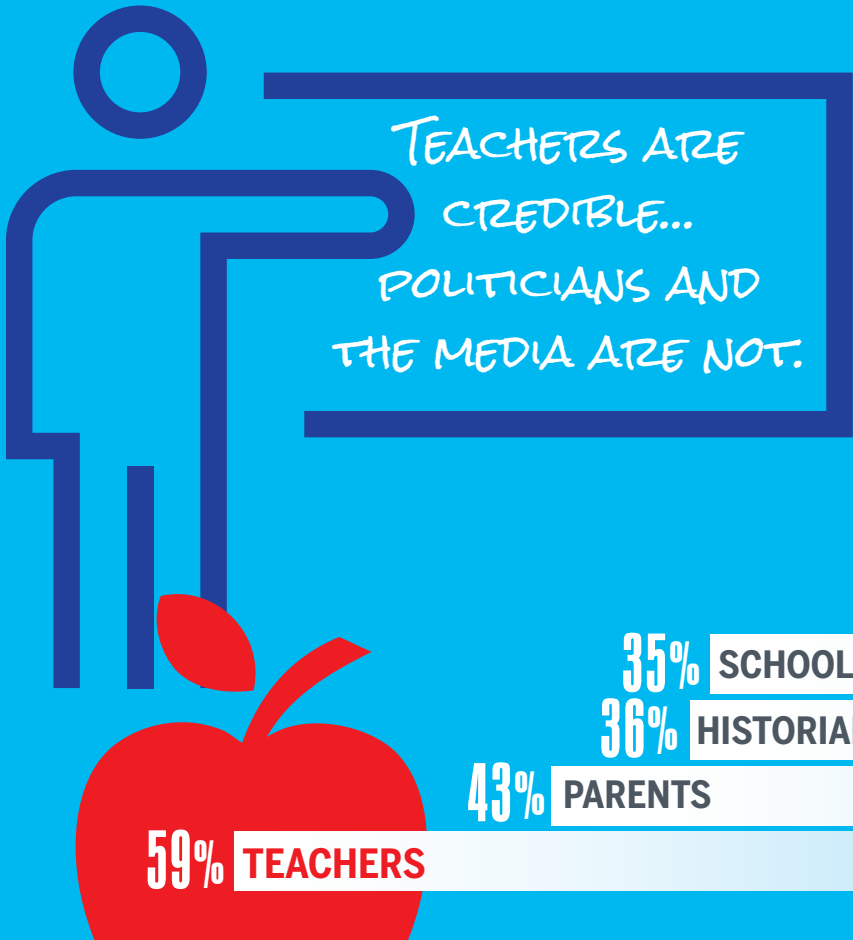
