Organization	Resources
Alliance for Decision Education	There is no bigger decision day than Election Day, and that's why the Alliance for Decision Education has centralized several resources that intersect Election Day and decision education, including cognitive bias awareness activities, a weight and rate chart, and data literacy tools.
Center for Civic Education	The Center for Civic Education has created lesson plans, 60-second videos, and a guide to federalism and election laws. Check out all their great resources!
Edward M. Kennedy Institute	EMK has several resources related to Election Day for all ages, including a <u>Campaign Poster</u> for elementary-aged youth, an <u>art project</u> for middle school students, and an electoral college <u>simulation</u> for middle and high school students.
Facing History and Ourselves	Facing History and Ourselves has led <u>online workshops</u> for teachers on Election Day, centralized their <u>teaching resources</u> on elections, and created a mini-lesson for this year's election,
Generation Citizen	Generation Citizen has created a <u>Rise Vote 2024</u> resource that includes tips and strategies for registering, informing, supporting, and empowering youth voices during the election.
Generation Nation	Generation Nation has created resources for North Carolina teachers. Check out their student election resources for the Charlotte-Mecklenburg region here.
Gilder Lehrman Institute	The Gilder Lehrman Institute includes a <u>variety of essays</u> , <u>primary sources</u> , <u>and online exhibitions</u> teachers can use to celebrate Election Day with their students.

PBS Learning Media	PBS Learning Media has created an Election Central with resources including Democracy 101, News and Current Issues, and classroom materials.
RetroReport	RetroReport has created several <u>short videos</u> teachers can use to help teach about the election and created a <u>lesson</u> called Politicking: A 19th Century Campaign Series, where students travel back in time and compare past elections and what they meant to the evolution of the nation's democracy.
Sphere Education	Sphere has created an <u>Election Hub</u> with classroom content, professional development videos, and events.
